#### <u>LICE</u>

A few cases of lice have been reported to the school. We want to make you aware to help stop the spread of the lice. Controlling the spread requires diligence on everyone's part to monitor and respond immediately in cases where head lice are discovered. Informing the school is an important element of the response to a case of head lice in a family that has children attending school. Lice will not go away on their own. They must be treated with an over the counter or prescription shampoo and conditioner as well as picking the nits off of the hair. #### THERAPY DOGS AT CRS

Booker arrives in the morning and works with students in a program called Special Learning With Booker, where children progress at their own level and pace, playing games, taking him for walks, talking to him with or without devices and so on. Dylan, comes to Chester Ronning in the afternoon for a Reading Tails program, where students choose a book they think Dylan would like to hear and work on developing their reading skills in a quiet, comfortable room on a one-to-one basis. Each visit is short, but we are beginning to see the effects of these programs into the home and classroom!

#### CHESTER RONNING'S WELLNESS TEAM

At the beginning of the school year, eight grade 4 and 5 students expressed great interest and were selected to be a part of a Wellness Team. Along with a few staff members, this team comes up with great ideas and activities to promote wellness in and around our school.
