#### **SCHOOL FEES**

A technology fee has been added to each student in Grade 1-5. These fees can be paid online by credit card, Visa Debit or Mastercard by going to the BRSD website at <u>www.brsd.ab.ca</u>.

All field trip/Activity fees will be added to the students account as these events come up and will be paid in the same method.

The Technology Fee enables Battle River School Division to purchase enhanced internet bandwidth and wireless infrastructure that allows us to have adequate, reliable internet for all devices in our schools, whether they are owned by the school division or by parents. The fee also allows us to utilize learning tools that all students have the potential to benefit from, such as Read and Write for Google, Screencastify, WeVideo, Razkids, Kami, KnowledgeHook and more.

#### HEALTH INFORMATION

Currently our school has had a student absentee rate of 20-30% over the last week and into this week. We don't know the exact reason why each student is away but we want to ensure families are aware of this. Please continue to use the Daily Checklist and let us know if your child is away due to illness or if you are testing your child.

Daily Checklist – please review this daily with your child. There have been some new changes made recently. Page 3&4 is for children under 18. <u>AHS Assessment Tool</u> – Use this if your child is unwell and you aren't sure what to do. <u>Medical Baseline</u> - If your child has asthma or allergies that present as similar symptoms to Covid-19, please use this form along with a doctor's note. # SAFETY PATROL

#### STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

https://www.brsd.ab.ca/families/student-insurance BRSD provides Blanket Student Accident Insurance, plus the Enhanced Option, for our students. Our schools participate in a program which provides accident insurance to eligible students who are residents of Canada, at no cost to parents. Full-time students are automatically covered. All eligible students are covered for injuries sustained while attending classes plus during school sanctioned trips and activities. Medical and/or dental expenses incurred as a result of injury can be reimbursed after all other sources of insurance (such as provincial health and the parents' employer insurance) are exhausted.

#### **WELLNESS**



Our focus this term is "Are you getting enough sleep?" There is a bulletin board close to the gym washrooms that displays information about the importance of sleep, why we need it, how much is needed per age group and some tips for relaxation before going to bed. Did you know that school-aged children (5-10 years of age) should be getting an average of 10-11 hours of sleep each night? Be sure to establish a bedtime routine in your home and find ways to offer comfort and relaxation to your child(ren) before bed each night. Happy sleeping!
